For many years, DEKRA has been recognizing the best projects, processes and solutions in three categories – Safety in transport, safety at work and safety in the home – together with *WirtschaftsWoche*, Germany's leading economics magazine. Companies and initiatives can apply now until September 15, 2017.

"DEKRA has set itself the task of creating greater safety, even in a digital world that is becoming increasingly complex," says Stefan Kölbl, Chairman of the Management Board of DEKRA e.V. and DEKRA SE. The criteria for nomination focus on effectiveness, simplicity, efficiency, innovation, sustainability, transferability and acceptance.

Once again, the Federal Ministry of Economics and Energy will take on the patronage of the DEKRA Award 2017. This year, the award ceremony will take place on Tuesday, October 24, 2017, at the tradition-rich Areal Böhler in Düsseldorf. As in previous years, a top-quality jury will preside over the selection of the award winners:
